(Allow) You may go now.

(Wish) May you live long!

(Possibility) It may rain tomorrow

MIGHT:-

(Less Possibility) Your bag might be with Priya.

(Part of May) He said that he might can late.

Would:-

(Part of will) She said that she would not go to Delhi.

(Polite Request) Would you spare some time for me?

(Preference) I would like to have a cup of coffee.

Should:-

(Advice) You should apply for this job.

(Suggestion) She should be more punctual in the office.

(Caution) Children should avoid eating junk food.

(Condition) Make haste lest you should miss the train.

Must:-

(Strong obligation) You must clean your room before lunch.

(No option) You must show yourself to a doctor urgently.

(Rules/ laws) Drivers must stop when the traffic lights are red.
