

Modals: - The modal verbs are used with other verbs to express ability, obligation, possibility, and so on:

Examples: May I come in? You can speak English.

Total number of Modals are 13:

1.Can	2. Could	3. May	4. Might
5. Shall	6. Should	7. Will	8. Would
9. Must	10. Dare	11. Need	12. Have to
13. Ought to (not in use)			

Can: - सकता है, सकती है, सकते हैं

1. Ability to do a job or work:

I can do this sum./ I can speak English.

2. Possession of specific power:

Only Principal can grant him leave.

3. Sanction:

You cannot leave the country.

4. Permission or request:

Can you do this?/ You can go now.

Could: - सकता था, सकती थी, सकते थे

1. Ability in past:

I could not stop him.

2. Request:

Could I use your mobile?

3. Suggestion:

You could wait or call again later.

May: - शायद, संभावना या अनुमान, अनुमति लेना या देना

 Possibility: He may be right.
Permission: May I come in?
Prediction: (50%)
It may rain today.

4. Wish/Prayer:

May you live long!

Might: - शायद ही, बहुत कम संभावना

1. Possibility:

I might be late for the meeting.

2. Prediction: (10%)

Amit might score good marks this time.

3. Conditional:

If you had called me, I might have

come.

Shall: - command, promise, threat, determination

1. Command:

I say she shall do it.

2. Promise:

Amit shall meet you at the station.

3. Suggestion:

Shall we leave now?

4. Threat:

He shall be punished for his rude behaviour.

Will: - willingness, promise, certainty, threat, determination

Determination:
We will win the match.
Promise:
I will stop smoking .

3. Threat:

I will teach him a lesson?

Should: - Advice, Suggestion, duty, obligation

1. Advice:

You should drive carefully.

2. Obligation:

You should switch off the lights when you leave the room.

3. Use with lest (ऐसा न हो की):

Run slow lest you should fall down.

Would: - wish, request, conditional, past form (will)

1. Wish:

I would like to have a cup of coffee.

2. Request:

Would you shut the door, please?

3. Past of will:

She said that he would call her back.

- 4. Conditional:
- If I were you, I would have helped her.

Must: - strong obligation, certainty

The children must read well.

I must go home now.

She must obey my orders.

You must be about 30 years old. (certainty)

<u> Dare: - हिम्मत करना</u>

You dare say that again.

I dare you to come alone.

How dare you talk to me?

They dare work here without my permission.

<u> Need: - जरुरत होना</u>

I need you.

You need not say that.

He need to learn manners.

They need to leave now.

Have to: - necessity or obligation

I have to study tonight.

They have to go to the meeting today.

Do I have to tell you everything?

Does she have to stay here?
